

EMpower Guidance on Monitoring and Evaluating Changes in Gender Beliefs and Norms

This guidance provides EMpower grantees with an instrument adapted from Promundo's GEM Scale to help determine if there have been changes in gender beliefs and norms among youth, or among adults working, as a result of your programming. These instruments assess attitudes about equitable roles for men/boys and women/girls. We have also included other resources that you might find useful.

Definitions

- **Gender** refers to the attitudes, feelings, and behaviors that are socially constructed from earliest childhood and that a given culture associates with a person's biological sex. ¹
- Gender discrimination: more often affects girls, women, and transgender people. Restrictive
 gender norms are integrated into social, political and economic structures that limit life
 opportunities and degree of power or autonomy in the family and the community.
- Gender-based violence (GBV): GBV is an umbrella term for any harmful act that is based on
 inequitable gender norms.² It includes acts that inflict physical, sexual or mental harm or
 suffering, threats of such acts, and coercion, and other deprivations of liberty. GBV most often
 affects girls and women (referred to as violence against women), but can also affect either sex
 on the basis of sexual orientation or gender identity.

Scale F.2.on page 51, Attitudes Towards Women, has been tested in the USA, and if used, should be
adapted to your program. For example, the item "More encouragement in a family should be given to
sons than daughters to go to college" may be changed to "More encouragement in a family should be
given to sons than daughters to finish secondary school."

Using adapted GEM Scale Statements as a gender attitudes measurement tool

The GEM scale was developed by Promundo, and is a validated attitude scale that has been adapted and applied in more than 20 settings. The number and content of items varies in different country applications of the GEM Scale. For example, the India adaptation had 15: 11 original items and 4 new items specific to the country. The Ethiopian adaptation had 24 items, 18 original and 6 new. Versions exist in Spanish, Portuguese, and other languages through Promundo. The following handout and scoring guide are adapted from the GEM Scale and could be used as a written or oral pre- and post-test. As for all such measures, the statements may need to be adapted depending on the age of the young people, whether given to males, females, or both, and to be culturally appropriate.

Scoring Guide

Note that all the items with a "1" under "agree" indicate low gender inequity in attitudes or beliefs, while all the items with a "3" under "agree" indicate high gender equity.

You should feel free to mix up equitable and inequitable statements more than in this example, and adapt language to your culture. To illustrate: for Q#15, "if a guy gets a woman pregnant, the child is the woman's responsibility" could be a low-scoring alternative to the current statement: "If a boy/man gets a girl/woman pregnant, the child is the responsibility of both." So the new Q#15 would be scored "1" under "strongly agree."
